Let's get you started

From researching courses to attending open days, the process of applying for university can be a daunting task. But it doesn't have to be. Let us guide you through it.

1. Starting the journey: research

It is important to do plenty of research when looking at which universities to apply for. Look into the courses that interest you the most and what those courses could lead onto.

2. Order a Prospectus

By ordering this prospectus you already have lots of information to help you – remember to also check out the online webpages for further information.

3. Open Days

Open Days are a great way to visit us, hear from the academics who would teach you, and see the accommodation you could end up living in.

4. Application preparation

A good personal statement is an important part of the application process. We're interested in you as an individual, so tell us about yourself and what interests you!

5. Applying

Applying for university can be done in a variety of ways. UK students should apply through UCAS, whereas international students can apply via UCAS or directly through our website.





8. Student finance

If needs be, you should also apply for student finance at this point. Advice on fees and funding can be found on pages 146-148. If you are an international student, you will also need to pay a tuition fee deposit.





6. English language requirements

If your main language is not English, you will need to show us that your English is at the right level to enable you to study here successfully. See pages 140-141 for further information.



9. Accommodation

Once you've been made an offer, we'll contact you about accommodation options. You can choose to live in university halls, rent off a private landlord or live at home. Find out more about accommodation options on pages 28-30.





7. Applicant Days

All applicants are invited to an applicant event, where you can find out more about your chosen course and explore the university and city where you could end up living!



10. Results and confirmation

Once you have received your results, you will receive an update from the University letting you know if you have met the terms of the offer.



11. Visas

If you're an international student, you may need to apply for a visa to study here. We will send you guidance on this once your offer is confirmed.



12. Get yourself to Oxford!

The final step is enrolment and moving in. We run a welcome week of induction activities to help you settle in and make new friends.

11. Ashmolean Museum


With free entry, this art and archaeology museum has world famous collections, including Egyptian mummies and the largest collection of Raphael drawings.

PRE-SESSIONAL ENGLISH

Our pre-sessional English courses help you meet the language requirements of your degree, and can be combined with our foundation courses.

Pre-sessional English is taught in 6-12 week blocks at four different levels. You can take consecutive course blocks until you reach the level required for your degree course.

If you need IELTS 6.0 with 6.0 in reading and writing, 5.5 in speaking and listening (required for most undergraduate courses), you can see in the table above approximately how long you need to study depending on your current and required language level.



INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION COURSES

If you do not meet the minimum academic requirements for our undergraduate courses, you may still be able to apply for one of our international foundation courses.

Our foundation courses provide a bridge between school study in your home country and undergraduate study, and offer a guaranteed pathway to an undergraduate degree if you pass with required grades.

Clearing

If you are not successful, remember that it is still possible to apply for courses through Clearing. Courses that have not been filled by August will be put into Clearing and listed at www.brookes. ac.uk/clearing and at www.ucas.com.

Enrolment

You need to meet the conditions of your offer by 31 August in the academic year in which you apply. If you are applying to a teacher education, healthcare or social work course, you'll need to complete additional steps necessary for you to study the programme (such as a DBS clearance) by 31 July. We'll explain this in the online course page for the courses you are interested in.

When we know for certain that you are coming to Oxford Brookes (when you have either accepted an unconditional offer or finalised an offer after meeting the conditions) we will send you details of how to enrol online. Once you have completed enrolment, you'll be given access to our online student system.

In July, UCAS publishes examination results for the International Baccalaureate and Access to Higher Education Diploma courses. In August, BTEC and A-level results are published.

If your offer is conditional upon obtaining certain grades in other qualifications (for example, English language tests, the European Baccalaureate or other international qualifications), you must send details of your results in writing by email or post directly to the Admissions Office. If you have met the conditions of our offer, UCAS or the Admissions Office will provide you with confirmation of this.

If your results do not quite meet the conditions of the offer, it doesn't automatically mean that you will not be accepted. Your application will then be given further consideration.

Entry qualifications and typical offers

We accept a wide range of qualifications. Our admissions team will help you work out your own combination of likely grades and qualifications, which can include credit gained from previous work experience or training.

Wherever possible we make our conditional offers using the UCAS tariff. Please see page 149 for a breakdown of how to calculate your tariff score. This gives great flexibility, particularly if you are offering a mix of qualifications, such as two A-levels plus a BTEC National Extended Certificate.

In many cases we don't specify grades to be achieved, because we are looking for achievement across a range of qualifications or subjects.

For a general guide to the grades required, please look at the online course pages.

First degrees

Our standard entry requirement is three A-levels or equivalent qualifications. In some cases, courses have specific required subjects and additional GCSE requirements.



In addition to A-levels, we accept a wide range of other qualifications including:

- the Welsh Baccalaureate
- the Access to Higher Education Diploma
- a BTEC National Certificate, Diploma or Extended Diploma at a good standard and in a relevant subject
- the International Baccalaureate Diploma
- the European Baccalaureate Diploma
- Scottish qualifications five subjects in SCE with two at Higher level or one at Advanced Higher level, or three subjects in Scottish Highers or two at Advanced Higher level
- a recognised foundation course (for our international foundation courses please see page 140).

Contextual admissions

At Oxford Brookes University, we want to attract students from all backgrounds who have the potential to succeed.

We seek to be a fully inclusive institution that reflects society at large, and provides an excellent student experience, a breadth of opportunities and successful outcomes for all students irrespective of their background.

Our Contextual Admissions policy forms part of our commitment to ensuring that all students with the potential to succeed at Oxford Brookes have equality of access.

It allows us to use a range of national and individual data to ensure that we are taking a rounded view of an individual applicant's potential.

It also supports us to make a reduced offer to students where the evidence suggests that their prior attainment may not be a full reflection of their future potential.

Medical and police clearance

All applicants who receive an offer for a teacher education, healthcare or social work course are checked through the Disclosure and Barring Service and the Independent Safeguarding Authority, and must have satisfactory occupational health screening in order to study.

International qualifications

If your academic qualifications do not meet these requirements we offer a range of international foundation courses (see page 140).

English language requirements

If your main language is not English, you will need to show us that your English is at the right level to enable you to study here successfully.

To start an undergraduate degree you will need to meet our English language entry requirements as well as the required academic qualifications:

• IELTS band 6.0-7.0 or above (including 6.0 in reading and writing, and 5.5 in listening and speaking).

IELTS is one of the most common tests. For details of other English language qualifications we accept, please visit www.brookes.ac.uk/international/apply.

Please note that courses require different scores within the range given, so please check individual course details on our website.

If you need a student visa to come to the UK you will need to meet the UK Visa and Immigration English language requirements – see www.brookes. ac.uk/international/apply.

University English course (pre-sessional)

If you do not meet the required English language level you can apply for one of our pre-sessional English courses (see page 140).

UK fees and funding

At Oxford Brookes there are several options available to support you in funding your studies. Our course fees for UK students are £9,250* a year.

Loans for full-time UK students

You don't need to pay any tuition fees while you are at university. Instead, the government provides a tuition fee loan which you start to pay back once you leave university and are earning above £26,575* a year.

The government also provides a maintenance loan to contribute towards living costs.

You start to pay this back at the same time as your tuition fee loan. Your repayments will be 9% of any income above $£26,575^*$, so the amount you repay each month will depend on your earnings.

Examples of monthly repayments for loans covering tuition and living costs:

Salary	Monthly repayments
£26,575	03
£30,000	£26
£35,000	£63
£40,000	£100

Repayments will be taken automatically from your salary through the tax system. If your yearly income falls below £26,575 your repayments will automatically stop. All outstanding repayments will be written off after 30 years.



Part-time UK students

If you are thinking of studying part-time you will also be eligible for a loan to cover the cost of tuition and a maintenance loan for your living costs. You will only start to repay both once you have finished your course and are earning above £26,575* a year.

Foundation degrees

If you are a full-time UK student studying for a foundation degree with one of our partner colleges, you will be charged $\mathfrak{L}7,570^*$ a year. You may then have the option of topping up to a full bachelor's degree at the same college for one year's further study, also charged at $\mathfrak{L}7,570^*$. If you come to Oxford Brookes to top up, you will be charged $\mathfrak{L}9,250^*$.

Field trip costs

The cost of any field trips that form a mandatory part of your course are included in your tuition fees. Optional field trips are not included, and you will have to pay a separate fee.

Bursaries

Bursaries are additional sums of money that do not have to be paid back. Full time UK students with household incomes under £35,000 can benefit from our means-tested Oxford Brookes Living Bursary*. Students with household incomes under £25,000 from recognised postcodes and students who are over 21 can also benefit from an enhanced bursary of up to £3,000.

Nursing grants

All UK nursing students on courses from September 2020 will receive government funding of at least £5,000 a year which they will not need to pay back.

Government support for living costs

All UK students are eligible for a maintenance loan to help cover living costs. The amount you can borrow will depend on your household income. Full-time UK students with household incomes below £25,000* are entitled to a maintenance loan of up to £9,203*.

Further government support

Additional funding is available for disabled students, students with children and students with adult dependants. This funding does not need to be paid back. For further information, see www.gov.uk/student-finance.

If you are an EU or non-UK student it's likely you will have to pay international fees.

EU students

From September 2021, students from the EU will have to pay international student fees. We deeply value our students from the EU and we will continue to do all we can to welcome EU students long into the future. Therefore we are pleased to offer a support scholarship to EU students taking degree courses at Oxford Brookes, please see our website for more details.

International students

Fees for international students are set annually and the cost depends on the course you study. The tuition fee for one year's full-time undergraduate study in 2022-23 will be approximately £14,300 to £15,200. You will receive information about how and when to pay your fees before your course starts.

Tuition fee deposits

All international students will need to pay a deposit of £3,000 to secure your place at Oxford Brookes. This deposit will be deducted from your first tuition fees payment.
